What It Is

Wolverine Enterprises is a student-based enterprise made up of six micro-enterprises: Ag Enterprises, Precision Manufacturing, Machining, Fine Arts & Design, Frozen Feasts, and Print Services. Launched through the Ready Schools Initiative, this work-based learning (WBL) program provides students with authentic, hands-on experience operating real businesses within a simulated school-based setting. The experience is sustained, aligned with coursework, and guided by educators in collaboration with industry and community partners such as Conexus Indiana, the Greene County Community Foundation, and Lilly Endowment Inc.

What Students Do

Students apply academic and technical skills in real-world business settings. They are expected to:

Participate for at least 25 hours, fulfilling WBL criteria

- Operate in specific business units to complete customer orders, manage logistics, and maintain quality control
- · Demonstrate professional behavior, collaboration, and problem-solving
- Align their work with career and technical education (CTE) standards and receive feedback from advisors
- Contribute to business goals such as client satisfaction and community service

Industry Involvement

Employers and business professionals actively support Wolverine Enterprises by serving on the Executive Board, providing mentorship and feedback, setting real-world quality expectations, and collaborating on client projects and community-based initiatives. Their involvement helps ensure the program remains relevant and aligned with evolving industry needs.
